We acknowledge that outbreaks of many communicable diseases in schools are actually a reflection of infection spreading in the general community and are difficult to prevent.

We are aware that some communicable disease can be passed on before a person becomes unwell while others can be transmitted by apparently-well carriers of a disease. Therefore, it is very important for us to maintain high standards of basic cleanliness and hygiene at all times.

## Aims

• To have in place health and safety procedures and guidance to deal with the prevention of the spread of communicable diseases.

## Procedure

Role of the Governing Body	<ul> <li>The GB has:</li> <li>appointed a member of staff to be the Coordinator for Health and Safety; Mr Daniel Duncalf</li> <li>nominated a link governor to visit the school regularly, to liaise with the coordinator and to report back to the GB; Mr Steve Sayer</li> <li>the authority to close the school in the event of an outbreak of infectious disease;</li> <li>a responsibility for the effective implementation,</li> </ul>	
Role of the Headteacher	<ul> <li>monitoring and evaluation of this policy.</li> <li>The Headteacher will: <ul> <li>ensure school personnel and parents are aware of the health and safety procedures involving communicable diseases;</li> <li>monitor the levels of absenteeism;</li> <li>notify the school nurse and the Health Protection Unit of problems relating to communicable diseases;</li> <li>inform the LA of problems relating to communicable diseases;</li> <li>inform parents of any outbreak of an infectious disease;</li> <li>enforce individual medical exclusion from school.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

Role of the Local Authority	<ul> <li>The LA will:</li> <li>keep schools updated with new guidance on the control of communicable diseases;</li> <li>liaise with all statutory health organisations.</li> </ul>	
Procedures to Deal with an Outbreak of Disease	<ul> <li>The school will be aware of an outbreak of an infectious disease by: <ul> <li>a sudden increase in the number of absentees;</li> <li>reports from parents that their children are suffering from an infectious disease;</li> <li>the mode of transmission;</li> <li>the HPU contacting the school.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The Headteacher will: <ul> <li>contact the LA and the Health Protection Unit with all the relevant details;</li> <li>inform parents/carers of the situation and refer them to the HPA website for information on how to deal with the infection.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Medical Exclusions	<ul> <li>Parents will be requested not to send their children to school when they are ill.</li> <li>Pupils who become ill during the school day will be taken home by their parents.</li> <li>Pupils suffering from infectious diseases should remain at home for the minimum recommended period.</li> </ul>
