




The King and the Ring



King Bing had lots of silver rings and chains. King Bing had spent a lot of coins to get them.




His best ring was bright red. He put a cloth on it to polish it.




On a dark night, a gang put a brick in the glass. The glass went BANG!




The men got in and took the ring that was on a shelf next to King Bing. In the morning, King Bing got up and was upset. He lost his best ring.
