Literacy

We are continuing to base our Literacy tasks around the book 'Super Worm' by Julia Donaldson.

Task 1

Choose a minibeast you would like to investigate and make a fact file about them. I have attached an example template but feel free to make your own, you may choose to make your own booklet!

Phonics

Continue learning 3 new sounds based on the needs of your child from the Phonics assessment given previously. If you would like to do the assessment again, please find the document provided in this weeks Home Learning Section.

Please use the YouTube Lessons from 'Letters and Sounds for home and school'. It would hugely benefit the children to watch the 'Reception lessons' such as https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=siVkXoEQDNc as well as the 'Learning to blend lessons' such as https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gCaXHnaKhHQ every weekday. They are released every week day at 10am.

Please see within the Reception Section for Home Learning the Phonics section where I will be uploading different activities you can use with your child depending on the sound/s you are working on.

Phonics Games

A few examples of games are:

- Splat-the-sound. Play this game with adults at home or siblings. Lay a selection of sounds out on a table/on the floor. One person is in charge; they say a sound and the first person to splat their hand on the correct sound wins it. Continue playing until all the sounds have been won.
- Quick-Write. Say a sound, the first person to write it down correctly is the winner.
- Memory game. Place a number of sound cards on the table face-up. Everyone playing the game has time to memorise the sounds before turning the cards face down. Point to a card, say the

- sound then turn it over. If you get the sound correct you get to keep it. Increase the number of sounds to make it more challenging.
- Phoneme spotter. Chose a focus sound then search in books/magazines/newspapers for that phoneme in words.
- Play teachers; you would be amazed at how excited some children get using the green pen!

Maths

This week we are continuing to focus on subtraction. As explained in the original pack handed out for Week 1 and Week 2 we try and follow the approach of using objects > pictures > abstract to teach this concept. This week there is a focus on pictures and abstract. Remember to discuss the different words used when subtracting (taking away, minus) with your child.

Task 1

Subtraction from 10 using pictures and a number line. Please find the worksheets attached with 3 different levels of difficulty, available in colour or black and white. The most difficult sheet involves missing number problems, these go above Reception level, however I included them for those who have asked for challenge.


