
Ash Wednesday and Lent





Lent is a very special time. Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. We go to mass and get ashes


put on our forehead.

They are made by burning last year's palm crosses.








Here is a priest with a Palm Cross and some ashes. Lent lasts for 40 days and 40 nights because that's how long Jesus went to pray for.

The Ashes are in a cross shape to remind us that Jesus died for us on a cross.







We use purple at special times in the church year and when it is Lent our Prayer Table will change from green to purple.



During Lent we must remember to pray like Jesus and show each other <u>Acts of</u> <u>Kindness.</u>
