The Wrong Kind of Flower

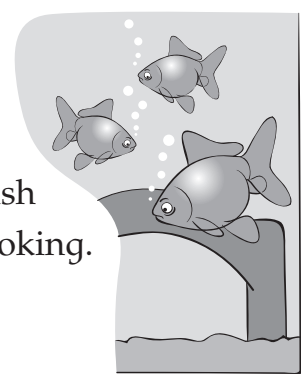
Finlay sat next to the fish tank. He liked watching the fish. They were more interesting than the teacher.

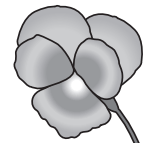
