<u>English</u>

<u>Monday</u> - What is a traditional tale? Look through the Powerpoint introduction to Traditional Tales and have a go at answering the quiz questions - name the story and name the character. Then, think about your favourite traditional tale and write your own set of clues for others to try and guess the story. Chose your favourite character and write some clues to describe them for others to guess.

<u>Tuesday</u> - The Gingerbread Man. Read the story and use the finger puppets to practise retelling the story at home. Have a go at performing it to your family or maybe see if you can make a film of yourself telling the story and share it with me on Google Classroom. There is also a missing words worksheet where you need to complete the missing parts of the story.

<u>Wednesday</u> - Sequence the pictures from the story of the Gingerbread Man. Next, have a go at completing the story map. There are three different difficulties for this task so choose the one that you want to complete.

<u>Thursday</u> - Now it's time for you to have a go at retelling the story in full. When you are writing the story, think about the vocabulary you are using, can you include some of the phrases from the story. Make sure you get the events in the correct order - you can use your story map to help with this. You can write your story on the Gingerbread Man lined paper, or use some paper you have at home.

<u>Friday</u> - This morning complete your spelling test. Ask and adult or older sibling at home to read your spellings out for you, let me know how you get on! Next, there is a suffix activity for you to complete. Add -ful or -less to the words to make an adjective.
